 <p>Rotarix (GSK) Rotavirus (oral)</p>	Rotavirus gastroenteritis	8 weeks and 12 weeks
 <p>Bexsero (GSK) MenB</p>	Meningococcal group B	8 weeks, 16 weeks and 1 year
 <p>Prevenar 13 (Pfizer) Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)</p>	Pneumococcal (13 serotypes)	12 weeks and 1 year
 <p>Menitorix (GSK) Hib/MenC</p>	<i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b (Hib) and meningococcal group C	1 year
 <p>MMRvaxPro (MSD) or Priorix (GSK) MMR</p>	Measles, mumps and rubella	1 year and 3 years 4 months
 <p>Fluenz Tetra (AstraZeneca) LAIV (nasal)</p>	Influenza	Eligible paediatric age groups*
 <p>Boostrix-IPV (GSK) dTaP/IPV</p>	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio	3 years 4 months; and pregnant women from 16 weeks gestation
 <p>Gardasil 9 (MSD) Human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV)</p>	Cancers and genital warts caused by specific human papillomavirus (HPV) types	12 to 13 years (school Year 8)
 <p>Revaxis (Sanofi Pasteur) Td/IPV</p>	Tetanus, diphtheria and polio	14 years (school Year 9)
 <p>Nimenrix (Pfizer) MenACWY</p>	Meningococcal groups A, C, W and Y	14 years (school Year 9)
 <p>Pneumovax 23 (MSD) Pneumococcal Polysaccharide Vaccine (PPV23)</p>	Pneumococcal (23 serotypes)	65 years (and certain at-risk groups)**
 <p>Shingrix (GSK) Shingles</p>	Shingles	From 1 September 2023 onwards: 50+ years and severely immunosuppressed; eligible age groups***; 70 years+ if Zostavax not available
 <p>Zostavax (MSD) whilst supplies available Shingles</p>	Shingles	70+ years of age (immunocompetent)***
