Introduction

Zambia gained independence from the United Kingdom in 1964. From 1911 to 1964 it was known as Northern Rhodesia. The name Zambia is derived from the name of the Zambezi river. Landlocked, it shares land boundaries with Angola, Botswana, Democratic Republic of Congo, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Tanzania and Zimbabwe.

Geographical names policy

For HMG use, geographical names should be taken from official sources from Zambia, where these are available. The Zambian national mapping agency is the Survey Department (ZS), which is within the Ministry of Lands and Natural Resources: <u>https://www.mlnr.gov.zm/?page_id=1995</u>. No products are available digitally, though they can be requested via an online form for a fee: <u>https://eservices.gov.zm/#/service/222</u>.

If no national official sources can be found, the <u>Africa Geoportal</u> may be used as a helpful source of geospatial data and names³; the US Board on Geographic Names (BGN) <u>Geographic Names Server</u> can also be used as a source for names.

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Languages

English is the only official language in Zambia, although it is spoken as a first language by less than 2% of the population. Nyanja (nya)⁴ and Bemba (*bem*) are the most widely spoken languages (each spoken by over 30% of the population), and these along with 5 others (Kaonde (*kqn*), Lozi (*loz*), Lunda (*lun*), Luvale (*lue*) and Tonga (*toi*)) all have regional status in their respective areas, and are used in primary education.
