Thank you for your email of 23 October 2023 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requesting the following information:

"I would like to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act.

It concerns the number of civil servants who are on specific 'homeworking contracts' which allow them to work five days a week from home. Please could you send this number for the following periods: 2022-23 2021-22 2020-21 2019-20

Could you also send the total number of civil servants employed by the department for each of these years."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that some of the information in scope of your request is held. However, some of the information you have requested falls entirely within the scope of an absolute exemption under Section 21 (Information reasonably accessible by other means) of the FOIA.

Section 21(1) has been applied to the second part of your request, as the information is already in the public domain and therefore, reasonably accessible to you. Section 21 is an absolute exemption and as such, there is no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information. The Biannual Civilian Personnel Report (BCPR) Table 1 is FTE, and Table 3 Headcount can be found at the following link:

In answer to the first part of your request, the table below records the number of Civil Servants on MOD Payroll, recorded as a home worker on the HR management system, by contractual agreement. The data records part-time workers who may not work five days a week as well as full time workers. It has not been possible to identify if the employee is contracted to do five days a week or if they are working compressed hours.

Figures record the number as at the 31 March for each year.

The data has been taken from MyHR and only includes core workforce departments that are managed on this platform. This excludes Royal Fleet Auxiliary (RFA), Agencies and Arm's Length Bodies.
