

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITTING (ENGLAND AND WALES) REGULATIONS 2016

Environmental Permitting (England) (Exercise of Functions) (Northumberland County Council) Direction 2023

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the power conferred by regulation 33(1)(b) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016, gives the following direction.

1. Citation and commencement

(1) This direction may be cited as the Environmental Permitting (England) (Exercise of Functions) (Northumberland County Council) Direction 2023 and comes into force on 31 July 2023.

(2) This direction replaces the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) (Exercise of Functions) (Northumberland County Council) Direction 2018, made 18 July 2018.

2. Interpretation

In this direction—

“operator” means Egger (UK) Ltd;

“premises” means the premises listed in Schedule 1;

“relevant activities” means the activities listed in Schedule 2 carried out at the premises;

“the 2016 Regulations” means the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016.

Exercise of functions

3. From the date this direction comes into force, and until such time as it is withdrawn or amended, the relevant activities exercisable under the 2016 Regulations by the Environment Agency in respect of the operator at the premises are exercisable by Northumberland County Council.

Combustion plant activities falling within the description in Part A(1) of Section 1.1 of Part 2 to Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations	Combustion plant activities.	Burning any fuel in an appliance with a rated thermal input of 50 or more megawatts.
