The place of origin in the ROI of the dogs leaving the ROI on each transport. Part postcode is acceptable if not able to name.

Details of each transport including date if dogs or paperwork were found to be non compliant.

Details and dates of any transports from any other country including the numbers of dogs on each transport imported to Many Tears Animal Rescue during the same period."

The Imports 1.1.23 to 17.7.23 extract shows imports to Many Tears Animal Rescue, during the period 1 January 2023 to 17 July 2023.

APHA are unable to provide origin postcodes as this information is not available. The field is not mandatory and has not been completed for the Import Notifications, therefore on this occasion we are unable to provide any postcode information.
