FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: 2023 FLEET LIST AND VEHICLES SOLD

We refer to your email dated 12 September 2023, which we received when copied in to an email on the 15 September 2023.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

of all vehicles currently on your fleet list and all vehicles sold between 14/11/2022 - 05/09/2023

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request. However, we need to advise you that some of the information is being withheld.

We have completed a public interest test and concluded that the balance favors engaging exemptions, Section 31 Law Enforcement and Section 38 Health and Safety and withholding some information.

Section 31(1) Law enforcement applies because providing all details of marked or unmarked vehicles would reveal some information that would undermine law enforcement.

Section 38(1)(b) Health and Safety applies because providing details of specialist and covert vehicles could endanger the safety of officers.

However, we are able to release some details of marked vehicles currently owned or leased by the Ministry of Defence Police. Please see Annex A.

If you wish to complain about the handling of your request, or the content of this response, you can request an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, Ground Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.gov.uk).

Please note that any request for an internal review should be made within 40 working days of the date of this response.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may raise your complaint directly to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
