Thank you for your emails of 21 October 2023 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD), requesting the following information:

"I wish to request a copy / copies of the "extensive legal advice" recently received by the Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre (JCCC) concerning their changes to the policy regarding licensing of works on historic aircraft crash sites under the Protection of Military Remains Act (1986) referred to in recent correspondence with the JCCC and including that from Brigadier Caroline Hull (head of Armed Forces and Veterans Services, Defence Business Services) dated 3rd August 2023.

I wish to request details of all processed licence applications made under the terms of the Protection of Military Remains Act (1986) for the excavation of, or work likely to cause disturbance to, aircraft crash sites from the 1st November 2022 to the present day.

The data I require for each instance is: date of application, aircraft type and serial number and stated place of crash. Also could you indicate as to whether a licence was granted or refused and the Applicant category, i.e. if the licence request was made by a private individual or museum, or on behalf of a commercial concern (i.e. developer, utility company or council, DPAA etc).

Finally could you also indicate the total number of any licence applications still under consideration

I wish to request the total number of licence applications granted under the terms of the Protection of Military Remains Act (1986) from the 1st January 2000 to the present day by commercial applicants (i.e. developers, utility companies or councils, DPAA etc), together with details (i.e. date of application, aircraft type, serial number, stated location on application) of all those, if any, where human remains were reported as being found."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). I would firstly like to apologise for the delay in replying.

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

 I wish to request a copy / copies of the "extensive legal advice" recently received by the Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre (JCCC) concerning their changes to the policy regarding licensing of works on historic aircraft crash sites under the Protection of Military Remains Act (1986) referred to in recent correspondence with the JCCC and including that from Brigadier Caroline Hull (head of Armed Forces and Veterans Services, Defence Business Services) dated 3rd August 2023.

The MOD holds no written legal advice either in documentary or email form pertaining to the legal advice sought.

The data I require for each instance is: date of application, aircraft type and serial number and stated place of crash. Also could you indicate as to whether a licence was granted or refused and the Applicant category, i.e. if the licence request was made by a private individual or museum, or on behalf of a commercial concern (i.e. developer, utility company or council, DPAA etc)."

This data can be found at Annex A below.

"Finally could you also indicate the total number of any licence applications still under consideration"

There were six licence applications still under consideration on 20 November 2023.

"I wish to request the total number of licence applications granted under the terms of the Protection of Military Remains Act (1986) from the 1st January 2000 to the present day by commercial applicants (i.e. developers, utility companies or councils, DPAA etc), together with details (i.e. date of application, aircraft type, serial number, stated location on application) of all those, if any, where human remains were reported as being found."


