

Teacher (Degree) Apprenticeship (TDA) secondary mathematics funding pilot: terms and conditions

The Department for Education (DfE) reserves the right to seek further clarification on any aspect of the applications received. This may involve applicants needing to supplement or clarify their responses or submit additional evidence or context. We'll attempt to clarify bids in writing but may invite applicants to attend an interview if they need a face-to-face meeting.

Except in cases of factual error, we will not accept any requests to reconsider its decision about which providers to take through to the pilot.

If your application is successful, we'll ask you to confirm in writing that you're committed to meeting our:

- expectations, as set out in what's involved
- monthly reporting requirements
- security requirements by protecting any personal data in line with UK GDPR requirements

By confirming this, you're indicating that you are content for us to start actively working with you to deliver the pilot.

We reserve the right to revoke your participation in the pilot and withdraw your approval if:

- you're not meeting our expectations
- you're not delivering to the requirements you have set out in your submitted application
- a third party has given us proof of non-compliance with your application

We reserve the right not to proceed with the wider roll-out of the funding pilot.

If your participation in the funding pilot is successful, you'll remain approved to offer the course if we roll out funding for the TDA more widely following the end of the pilot period. This is unless requirements for the pilot change substantially as a result of what we've learnt.

Pilot providers must comply with the ITT criteria and supporting information.

In all but the most serious cases of non-compliance, we'll give pilot providers the opportunity to address the problem before we start the formal process of <u>withdrawal of ITT accreditation</u>.

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
