The breeding programme for the Hereford cattle was approved on 1 January 2015 as detailed in the published list of recognised bovine societies which can be found at the link below:

The DEFRA approved rules of procedure for the Hereford Cattle Society CLG including the Article 18(1) Breeder request process, the Article 30(1) Breeder request process, the timely transmission of zootechnical certificates under Article 30(3), the validated "clearly established rules of procedure and described rights and duties of breeders. This is best achieved if the disputes are settled within the legal system of the Member State where they arise." therefore the dispute resolution procedures for the breeders participating in the breeding programme.

for all eligible pedigree animals to be entered into the herd book, regardless of membership status or country of origin.
