	<p>II.1 Animal Health Attestation</p> <p>I, the undersigned official veterinarian, hereby certify that the primates of the consignment described in Part 1 meet the following requirements:</p> <p>II.1.1 Country/Territory of origin</p> <p>i. Where disease prevention and control rules regarding Ebola (listed in the Annex and Article 2 of Implementing Regulation (EU) 2018/1882 for primates) are applied in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/429 Article 9 point 1.</p> <p>II.1.3 Animals</p> <p>i. are individually identified by means of a transponder;</p> <p>ii. have not been in contact with animals suspected of having rabies in the previous 6 months;</p> <p>iii. have been kept isolated from other animals not complying with at least the same health requirements as described in this certificate for the last 30 days and during their transportation from the premises of origin to the place of shipment;</p> <p>iv. were subjected, with a negative result, to a test for tuberculosis (bacteria of the Mycobacterium tuberculosis complex)², carried out in the isolation period (mentioned in II.1.3.iii) on (dd/mm/yyyy)³. A certified copy of the test result shall be attached to the certificate.</p> <p>v. have been examined within the period of 24 hours prior to the time of loading for dispatch to Ireland, and found to be free of clinical signs of infectious diseases including those referred to in</p>

Annex 1 of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/692 and emerging diseases and are fit for the intended transport;

- vi. there is no reason to suspect it/they have been exposed to an infectious disease prior to dispatch;
- vii. are not animals to be killed under a national programme for the eradication of disease;
- viii. their movement has been approved in advance by agreement of the Competent Authority in Ireland of destination (*Licence No.:* _____)

II.1.4 Parasite Treatment

At least one treatment for endo- and ectoparasites at the start (the first week) of the quarantine as mentioned in II.1.3.iii is carried out. Antiparasitic treatment as appropriate to species of animal and parasitic agent.

II.1.5 Animal transport attestation

I, undersigned official veterinarian, hereby certify that:

- i. Arrangements were made to transport the animals in compliance with Council Regulation (EC) No. 1/2005, IATA guidelines and/or CITES guidelines for transport, where applicable or of other recognised international standards for transport of animals, in particular as regards watering, feeding and the use of the transport container where applicable and it/they is/are fit for the intended transport;
- ii. The person in charge of the transport of animals submitted a signed written statement, which demonstrate that suitable arrangements have been made for the feeding, watering and care of the animal(s) during transport in accordance with the international standards recognised for the transport of animals;
- iii. A correctly authorised transporter will be used to transport this/these animals to Ireland;
- iv. Any transport box or container in which animals are loaded into, is used for the first time or it has been cleaned and disinfected before loading with an officially authorised disinfectant;
- v. Arrangements have been made to load the animal(s) for dispatch to Ireland into the means of transport described above, which has been so constructed that faeces, urine, litter, or fodder could not flow or fall out of the vehicle or container during transportation

- a) This certificate shall be completed according to the notes for the completion of certificates provided for in Chapter 4 of Annex I to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/2235
- b) This certificate is valid for 10 days from the date of its issue until the date of documentary and identity checks carried out at the first Border Control Post of entry to the European Union. In the case of transport by sea, the validity of the certificate is extended by the additional period corresponding to the duration of the journey by sea.
