Part II: Certification

II.1 Animal Health Attestation

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, hereby certify that the 'other carnivores'^(a) of the consignment described in Part I meet the following requirements:

II.1.1 Country/Territory of origin

The country or territory described in boxes I.7. and I.8 is a WOAHA member country where rabies is a notifiable disease;

II.1.2 Premises of origin as described in box I.11:

- i) is [approved][registered]¹ by a GB competent authority;
- ii) is not subject to national restrictions for animal health reasons;
- iii) where there have been no clinical cases of rabies in the 6 months prior to the date of issue of this certificate;
- iv) where there have been no reports of Brucella spp. and Tuberculosis spp. in the 12 months prior to the date of issue of this certificate;
- v) [in which the animals have remained since birth or were resident for at least 6 months prior to issue of this certificate]¹
or
[[in which the animals have remained since birth or were resident for at least 3 months prior to issue of this certificate]^{1,2}
- vi) is under veterinary supervision and is subject to animal health surveillance and biosecurity measures according to the 'Animal Health Regulation' (Reg (EU) 2016/429)
- vii) where animals added to the establishment, and susceptible to diseases relevant to the animals to be exported, are quarantined and will remain in their quarantine for at least 30 days if imported or if they come from establishments of a lower health status.

II.1.3 Animals

- i. are individually identified by means of an implanted transponder;
- ii. have not been in contact with animals suspected of having rabies in the previous 6 months;
- iii. have been kept isolated from other animals not complying with at least the same health requirements as described in this certificate for the last 30 days and if applicable, during their transportation from the premises of origin to the place of loading;
- iv. have been examined within the period of 24 hours prior to the time of loading for dispatch to Ireland, and found to be free of clinical signs of infectious diseases including those referred to in Annex 1 of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/692 and emerging diseases and are fit for the intended transport;
- v. there is no reason to suspect it/they have been exposed to an infectious disease prior to issue of this certificate;
- vi. are not animals to be killed under a national programme for the eradication of disease;
- vii. [in the case of mustelids (Mustelidae) and raccoons (Procyon), the animals were tested for SARS-Cov-2 infection with negative results]¹
- viii. their movement has been approved in advance by agreement of the Irish Competent Authority (*Licence No.:* _____)

II.1.4 Rabies Vaccination

The animal(s) were at least 12 weeks old at the time of vaccination against rabies and at least 21 days have elapsed since the completion of the primary anti-rabies vaccination carried out in accordance with the validity requirements set out in Annex III to Regulation (EU) 576/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council, and any subsequent revaccination was carried out within the period of validity of the preceding vaccination;

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II.1.6 Animal transport attestation

I, undersigned Official Veterinarian, hereby certify that:

- i. Arrangements were made to transport the animals in compliance with Council Regulation (EC) No. 1/2005, IATA guidelines and/or CITES guidelines for transport, where applicable or of other recognised international standards for transport of animals, in particular as regards watering, feeding and the use of the transport container where applicable and it/they is/are fit for the intended transport;
- ii. The person in charge of the transport of animals submitted a signed written statement, which demonstrates that suitable arrangements have been made for the feeding, watering and care of the animal(s) during transport in accordance with the international standards recognised for the transport of animals;
- iii. A correctly authorised transporter will be used to transport this/these animals to Ireland;
- iv. Any transport box or container in which animals are loaded into, is used for the first time or it has been cleaned and disinfected before loading with an officially authorised disinfectant;
- v. Arrangements have been made to load the animal(s) for dispatch to Ireland into the transport box/container above, which has been so constructed that faeces, urine, litter, or fodder could not flow or fall out of the vehicle or container during transportation.

II.1.7 They are not an invasive exotic species according to Regulation (EU) no. 1143/2014.

Notes:

- a) This certificate is intended for ‘other carnivores’ meaning mammals of the species belonging to the order Carnivora, other than dogs, cats and ferrets (Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/688, Article 3(32)). Marine mammals and ‘other carnivores’ as pets are not covered by this certificate.
- b) This certificate shall be completed according to the notes for the completion of certificates provided for in Chapter 4 of Annex I to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/2235.
- c) This certificate is valid for 10 days from the date of its issue until the date of documentary and identity checks carried out at the first Border Control Post of entry to the European Union, whichever occurs earliest. In the case of transport by sea, the validity of the certificate is extended by the additional period corresponding to the duration of the journey by sea.
