

Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (Section 62A Applications)

Development of a ground mounted solar farm with a generation capacity of up to 49.99MW, together with associated infrastructure and landscaping

By order of the High Court, our decision on this application dated 9 May 2023 has been ordered to be re-determined.

A hearing in respect of the above application will be held at **10.00am on 26 March 2024** at the Council Chamber, Uttlesford District Council, London Road, Saffron Walden, CB11 4ER

The Inspector appointed to hold the hearing is P Griffiths BSc(Hons) BArch IHBC. The hearing will follow the guidelines set out in the Town and Country Planning (Section 62A Applications) (Hearings) Rules 2013 (SI 2013 No. 2141).

The issues report will be published on the website at least 5 working days before the date of the hearing. The agenda will be available at the hearing, and where possible, it will be published on the website the day before the hearing takes place. These documents will set out the issues that are relevant to the consideration of the application and, where appropriate, indicate the anticipated time limit for representations on each issue.

Any person who has made representations in relation to the application during the representation period, and when making those representations requested to be heard, may register to speak at the hearing.
