General Discussion Points

Trust Change

Points discussed in relation to academies moving to another trust.

Project: To discuss the application for the transfer of King Solomon International Business School, Birmingham, to Star Academies.

AB discussion:

- King Solomon International Business School (KSIBS) opened as a Free School in September 2015. It was judged Inadequate by Ofsted and requiring special measures in 2018. Following a period of exceptional support, provided by the Department, the trust in place at the time made the decision to transfer the school to a Multi-Academy Trust.
- In June 2023, the department were advised of Star Academies interest in taking KSIBS into their trust from its current trust which plans to close. The school would benefit from the support of Star who have an excellent track record in school improvement.
- Star Academies is a multi-academy trust with 33 schools which are both faith
 designated and non-faith. They are a highly capable trust with a strong track record,
 including in and around Birmingham. All sponsored academies in the trust have
 shown progress since joining the trust.
- The board sought assurances around the school's religious designation, finances, and pupil numbers, and discussed the curriculum offer at KSIBS under Star Academies.
- The board supported the recommendation.

RD decision: Approved.

Further actions required: To inform the Trusts.

Project: To discuss the application for the transfer of Florence MacWilliams Academy, Stoke-on-Trent, to Co-op Academies Trust.

AB discussion:

- In February 2021, Educo AT was approved to open Florence MacWilliams Secondary Free School.
- Educo AT has submitted a transfer application to join The Co-op Academies Trust.
- A permanent building is scheduled to open in September 2025, with planning permission currently being sought to provide 120 places in temporary accommodation in 2024/25. This has been confirmed as a necessity by the Local Authority.

- Co-op AT is a 33-academy trust with a presence in Stoke-on-Trent, as well as Manchester, Liverpool, Bradford, Kirklees and Leeds and has experience in successfully opening and running Free Schools.
- The board discussed the timetable for the transfer and the need for September 2024 school places in Stoke-on-Trent.
- The board supported the recommendation.

RD decision: Approved.

Conflicts: Tom Leverage, who has completed Trust and School Improvement work (TSIO) at trust level for The Co-op Academies Trust, was not present and did not receive the papers for this project.

Further actions required: To inform the Trusts.
