Thank you for your request for information which was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You requested the following information:

This is an information request relating to Diversity, Equality and Inclusion roles:

Please include the following information for the following years, 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22 and 2022/23:

- A list of all the staff networks at Home England
- Whether each network receives funding from Home England and, if so, how much (please express annually for the last four financial years)
- How much FTE equivalent staff time each network is entitled to. For example, a staff network may have a chair who's entitled to spend 10% of their working hours devoted to the network (please express annually for the last three financial years)
- A list of events that each network has held in this financial year so far (April to the present day), including the title of the event, information on any guest speakers and the time of the event

<u>Response</u>

We can confirm that we do hold some of the requested information. We do not hold information relating to all the financial years specified in the request. We will address each of your queries in turn below:

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A list of all the staff networks at Home England

We do not hold a list for all the years specified in the request as we do not record this information historically. We can provide a list of staff networks for the current financial year 2023/24. They are entitled as follows:

- Disability & Carers
- o Neurodiversity
- Build Together and Friends
- Lead Together
- o BAME
- Women in Digital
- o Faith
- Women's Inclusive

Whether each network receives funding from Home England and, if so, how much (please express annually for the last four financial years)

No funding is received although requests can be made for specific events. This information is not recorded in a way that could be distinguished from other event expenditure.

How much FTE equivalent staff time each network is entitled to. For example, a staff network may have a chair who's entitled to spend 10% of their working hours devoted to the network (please express annually for the last three financial years).

We can confirm there are no formal arrangements in place.

A list of events that each network has held in this financial year so far (April to the present day), including the title of the event, information on any guest speakers and the time of the event. Please see the table below for a list of events held by our staff networks.

Section 40 – Personal information

We are withholding some information on the grounds that in constitutes third party personal data and therefore engages section 40(2) of the FOIA. Specifically, we are withholding the names of staff who have been a guest speaker at network held events.

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To disclose personal data, such as names, contact details, addresses, email addresses and personal opinions could lead to the identification of third parties and would breach one or more of the data protection principles.

Section 40 is an absolute exemption which means that we do not need to consider the public interest in disclosure. Once it is established that the information is personal data of a third party and release would breach one or more of the data protection principles, then the exemption is engaged.
