Dear Sir,

I wish to object to this application for the following reasons:

- 1 This is a heritage site, a 2nd World War Prisoner of War Camp site, one of very few remaining
- 2 The land is outside the Development Limits of Hatfield Heath.
- 3 The land is Metropolitan Green Belt.
- 4 The entrance to the site is in Mill Lane, a very narrow lane known locally for lovely walks and wildlife, with no pavements for pedestrians.
- 5 No reason why holiday homes would be a great idea in this Village with flight paths going directly to and from Stansted Airport! In fact if they turn out not to be profitable these would be changed into full residential 5 bedroom houses...
- 6 This site would cause much more traffic in this quiet area.
- 7 Previous planning applications for this site have been refused and an Appeal in December 2019.
- 8 This is not a sustainable site.
- 9 A recent Housing Survey showed the Village needed 13 Affordable Homes which was supported by The Parish Council. Planning permission has been granted for these homes on an exception site and will be built shortly.
