I wish to inform you of my objections to the new plans for the holiday cottages and buildings which are intended to be built near West Lane in Hatfield Heath. Nearby we have a prison of war camp, which is a historical site that has been recognised by English Heritage and has featured in the media and on television. This site and the nearby area attracts many wildlife and this would be very disruptive to their development. Locals residents are very keen to preserve this war camp and to keep it for future generations to learn about our history.

These developments are unsuitable for our beautiful village. We have problems with very heavy traffic and the infrastructure of the area would simply not be able to cope. There are speeding issues in the village as it is a hub for roads leading off to many nearby towns and the city of Chelmsford. There is not enough parking for the villages, let alone the regular visitors who enjoy our green, our pubs and restaurants and the local supermarket store.

The local school is oversubscribed and some children who live in the village have to be educated in other locations. And the doctor's surgery has far too many people, catering for bigger places like Takeley and Little Canfield.

So please place on record my objections and consider them when you make the decision on whether this disruptive plan goes ahead.
