Thank you for your information request, dated **25th May 2023**, where you asked:
“Please provide all correspondence to and from the MHRA and the below companies between 1st January 2021 and to date:

- a) Philip Morris International**
- b) British American Tobacco**
- c) Imperial Tobacco**
- d) Gallagher Tobacco/Japan Tobacco International.**

I look forward to receiving the requested information within the statutory timeframe.”

The MHRA accepts intelligence provided by companies subject to Article 5.3 of the World Health Organization Framework Convention on Tobacco Control, and reviews any information with the appropriate consideration. The MHRA is unable to provide any responses in cases where those communications include statements that could be interpreted to provide opinion on, or influence:

- policy decisions
- operational delivery
- an ongoing investigation by the MHRA or regulatory stakeholders

The MHRA has determined that the information is exempt under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act and we cannot process your request any further.

Section 12 of the Act allows public authorities to refuse requests where the cost of dealing with them would exceed the appropriate limit, which for central government



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is set at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 24 working hours in determining whether the department holds the information, locating, retrieving and extracting the information.

We consider that this would take longer than 24 working hours to complete.

Please note that substantially similar requests made within 60 working days of an original request can be aggregated into one for the purposes of calculating a cost limit, meaning that section 12 could still apply.

If you have a query about the information provided, please reply to this email.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date you receive this response and addressed to: info@mhra.gov.uk

Please remember to quote the reference number above in any future communications.

If you were to remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you would have the right to apply directly to the Information Commissioner for a decision. Please bear in mind that the Information Commissioner will not normally review our handling of your request unless you have first contacted us to conduct an internal review.
