Each iDAP contains a complete listing of all suspected adverse reactions that have been reported to the MHRA via the Yellow Card scheme. This includes all reports received from healthcare professionals, members of the public, and pharmaceutical companies. It is important to note that reported adverse reactions have not been proven to be related to the drug, and should not be interpreted as a list of known side effects. Medicines are listed alphabetically by the name of the active ingredient.
