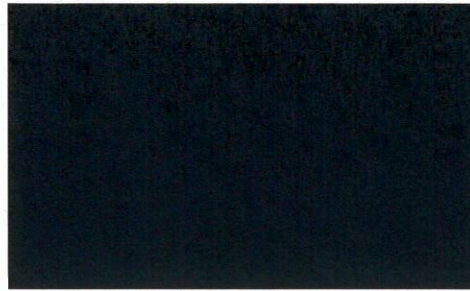

Release of Information

Thank you for your correspondence of 5 June 2020 in which you requested the following information:

'Non-Religious Chaplains employed by the Royal Navy – if any?'

Your enquiry has been considered to be a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and in response to your request, I can tell you that no Non-Religious Chaplains are employed by the Royal Navy.

Under section 16 (Advice and Assistance) of the Act, it may help if I explain that Armed Forces Chaplains must be ordained by one of the specified churches and have their permission to apply to join before an application can proceed. The joining criteria for the Royal Navy Chaplaincy branch is as follows:

RN Eligibility

1. Aged 25 to 48
2. Be a clergy member of one of the following churches: Anglican, Roman Catholic, Church of Scotland, Congregational, Presbyterian, Baptist, United Reformed, Assemblies of God, Elim Pentecostal, Methodist or Churches in Community
3. A theological degree or an equivalent recognised qualification.
4. To be employed by a church at the point of application, with a view to having three years of experience behind you by the time you complete your training.
5. You need to be able to pass the Royal Naval Fitness Test (RNFT) & Royal Naval Swimming Test (RNST).

6. A National of the United Kingdom, a Commonwealth citizen or Dual National.
