	JUDGMENT

1. The claimant's complaints of unfair (constructive) dismissal under s98 of the Employment Rights Act 1996 and of wrongful dismissal (notice pay) succeed and are upheld.

NOTES

1. The remedies hearing has been listed for 28 March 2024. The parties must comply with the case management orders made in preparation for that remedies hearing, which are set out in a separate document.

2. The Tribunal indicated that the claimant's compensatory award is likely to be subject to a 10% uplift due to a breach of the respondent's obligations under the ACAS Code. However, the Tribunal noted that no final decision had been made on any uplift, as per the EAT's guidance in <u>Slade and anor v Biggs and ors 2022 IRLR 216, EAT</u> which requires Tribunals to apply a 'final sense check' on the monetary figures awarded before reaching a conclusion on any uplift to the compensatory award for a breach of the ACAS Code.
