Under Item 33 of minutes of the fourth meeting of the Board of Management, the question of medical examination of personnel proceeding to Maralinga was discussed. It was decided that [Redacted] would have further discussions with [Redacted] at the Range and inform the Board of the outcome.

A signal has now been received from [Redacted], *to the effect (agreed with the Ministry)* that [Redacted] agrees that medical examinations are not required for visitors to the Range.

[Redacted] points out, however, that visitors who are to stay on the site for more than twenty four hours during trials should have a blood count taken before leaving for the Range and that copies of the records of the blood count should be sent to [Redacted] at Maralinga.

It is requested that you will advise all personnel visiting the Range to this effect.
