New Laws to protect consumers from cyber criminals come into force in the UK



World-first laws protecting UK consumers and businesses from hacking and cyber-attacks take effect today, Monday 29th April 2024.

Manufacturers of products such as phones, TVs and smart doorbells are now required to implement minimum security standards against cyber threats.

Consumers will benefit from banning of easily guessable default passwords, marking a significant leap in protecting individuals, society and the economy from cyber criminals.

OPSS attend the Battery Tech Expo 2024 at Silverstone in April



Product recalls spotlight:



<u>Babboe Cargo Bikes</u>: The product presents a risk of injuries as the frame of the bicycle may break when the product is in use

<u>Wireless Microphone HIFI Speaker sold via Temu</u>: The product contained a 18650 lithium cell which had exploded. The cell should have vented safely, releasing the pressure from the cell in a controlled manner.

<u>ByKallevig Evdano Upholstered dining chairs in grey and brown</u> (One of several ByKallevig chairs recalled): The product has been identified as presenting a risk of fire as they fail to meet the requirements of the relevant standard and do not provide the level of fire safety required.

<u>UPP Battery E-Bike Battery Packs sold via Amazon, AliBaba, eBay, Made in China and Desertcart:</u> The product presents a serious risk of fire.

<u>Ideal Heating Logic 2 Combi & System Boiler Range</u>: The product presents a risk of fire due to the dry operation, meaning the boiler lights gas but the heat generated doesn't cool it.

OOOOO Hairdryer sold by TX Maxx: The plug does not meet required safety standards and could cause electric shock, physical injury or damage to property.
