I have been asked to contact you by a local resident who suggested that I would be attending the hearing in the morning. Unfortunately I have two MS Teams conferences tomorrow so will not be available all day. I should however be available on 28 March if that helps as I understand from James Bunten that the Planning Inspector has agreed to accept these documents if I bring three copies to the meeting in person.

Essentially, the points I intend to make is that it is foreseeable that the cement materials contain amphibole and this is far more hazardous than chrysotile. As such the precautions need to be stricter. In the absence of sampling of all debris then it has to be assumed that the material contains crocidolite.

The second point is that the High Court has taken the view that very low levels of exposure to asbestos dust can cause mesothelioma. I gave evidence in both the cases referred to. All these points are in my written submissions, I am simply bringing the committee's attention to the evidence upon which they are based.

Am I OK to attend on 28 March and bring the extracts from these documents (I will highlight the relevant parts and keep my submissions to no more than 5 minutes). If so, would morning or afternoon be better?
