

Beware bluetongue

Know the risks!

Bluetongue was detected in England in November 2023 having spread from Europe. The virus is transmitted by biting midges and affects cattle and sheep and other species. It is a notifiable disease which means you must report it to APHA.

Midge activity will increase with warmer weather and with it the risk of bluetongue. Livestock keepers should:

Look out for signs of bluetongue. Speak to your vet for advice.

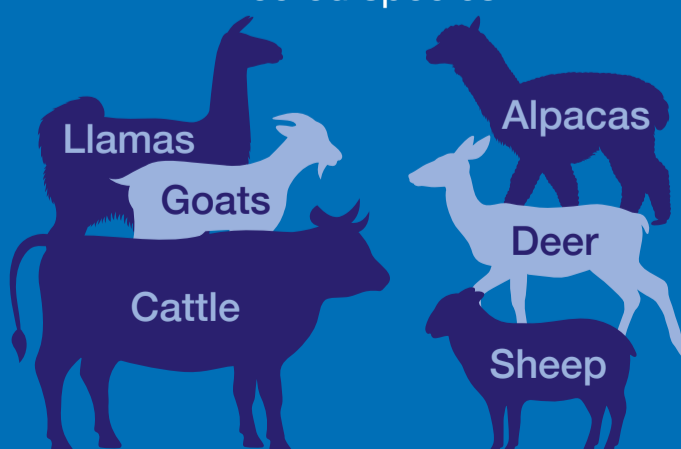
