Thank you for your email of 4 December 2023 and 7 February 2024 to Ministry of Defence (MOD), requesting the following information:

- "1. I seek disclosure/released copy of the full case file [hard copy and/or electronic disclosure(s) including as a non-exhaustive list: submissions for commemoration, reference documents, correspondences, discussion notes, photographs, findings and decision etc.] for the Non-Commemoration case for the late Lt. Col. Algernon Henry DUMARESQ, Royal Engineers, died 31 May 1917, undertaken on behalf of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission [Submission NC 11820].
- 2. Similarly, further disclosure(s) of any relevant previous file(s) etc. for submission(s)/decision(s) relating to Lt. Col. DUMARESQ [should they not be included in the previously referred to file, NC 11820].

I want the recent, 2023, JCCC / CWGC commemoration non-commemoration adjudication case file for the late Lt-Col DUMARESQ [and possibly previous such files(s)].

I await your full disclosure"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and information in scope of your request is held and can be found in the zip file at Annex A.

Please note that some documents are difficult to read due to the age of them, however, i can confirm that the copies attached are the clearest the department holds.

I can advise that some of the information in scope of your request falls entirely within the scope of the exemption provided for at Sections 40 (Personal Data) of the FOIA and has been redacted.

Section 40(2) has been applied to some of the information in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 2018. Section 40(2) requires the

Department to conduct a balancing exercise, this exercise involves balancing the rights and interests of individuals against the legitimate interests in disclosure, this is not the same as carrying out the public interest test associated with certain exemptions in FOIA.

The balancing exercise is carried out in order to decide whether the absolute exemption in section 40(2) is engaged. In particular, there is no assumption of disclosure in the legitimate interests test, as there is with qualified exemptions. The outcome of the balancing exercise lay in withholding the third-party personal data identified in the attached information.

If you wish to complain about the handling of your request, or the content of this response, you can request an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, Ground Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.gov.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review should be made within 40 working days of the date of this response.

ALGERNON HENRY DUMARESQ was the eldest son of Colonel (Honorary Major-General) Henry William Hart-Davis Dumaresq, Royal Engineers, and of Louisa, his wife, of High Lea, Bideford, Devon (b. at Limerick, June 4, 1870).

He was educated at the Glyngarth Preparatory School, Cheltenham, Glos. (1879–1881),

and at Clifton College (1882-1887).

He passed into the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, in the summer of 1887, and obtained a Commission in the Royal Engineers in February, 1889. He then proceeded to the School of Military Engineering, Chatham, where he was put through the two years' course of instruction provided there for the young officers of the Royal Engineers.

On the completion of the course at Chatham, he was sent to the Submarine-mining School, Gosport, for a course of instruction in submarine-mining, which at that date, and for many years subsequent thereto, formed a branch of the duties of the Corps of Royal Engineers. He was for two months at Gosport, a great part of the time being spent in carrying out practical work in connection with the Spithcad Defences.

His practical training being completed, he was for the next three years (Jan. 1891 – Feb. 1894) employed first at Chatham, and then at Cork Harbour, on duties connected with submarine-mining and electric lighting for Coast Defence purposes at these two important military areas. In Ireland his duties included the running of the Brennan dirigible-

torpedo installation at that time in operation at the entrance to Cork Harbour. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant, in February, 1892, whilst engaged upon these duties, and, just two years later, he was gazetted Assistant Instructor in Electricity at the School of Military Engineering, Chatham, an appointment which

he held for the next six years.

The Boer War broke out in October, 1899, whilst he was at Chatham. Reinforcements being required at the Front, he was, in February, 1900, sent out to South Africa in command of a Field Scarchlight Section; he was promoted Captain whilst on the voyage to the Cape. He remained on active service with the South African Field Force until January, 1901, and took part with his Section in the Operations in the Orange Free State (Feb.-May, 1900); the Operations in the Transvaal East of Pretoria (July-Nov., 1900); the Operations in the Orange River Colony (May-Nov., 1900); and the Operations in the Transvaal (Nov., 1900-Jan., 1901). For his services in this campaign, he was awarded the Queen's Medal with three clasps.

He returned Home in February, 1901, and was given a post in the Office of the Inspector-General of Fortifications, an Office which, under the War Office Re-organization Scheme of 1904, became the Directorate of Fortifications and Works. His duties at the War Office were concerned entirely with the administration of the various electrical services connected with the Army. He was closely associated with the inception and completion of the War Department Power Station and distribution system erected and installed at Aldershot, which to this day remains the largest War Department electric installation in existence.

After spending five years at the War Office, he proceeded, in the spring of 1906, to Egypt for a tour of foreign service, and remained in that country three years. Whilst serving abroad he was promoted Major (October, 1908).

When, in February, 1909, the Chief Instructorship in Electricity at the School of Military Engineering, Chatham, became vacant, he was ordered Home to fill the appointment, and held it until September, 1912. On the date last mentioned, he was once more transferred to London on being gazetted Inspector of Electric Lights at the War Office. He was holding this appointment when war was declared in August, 1914. The outbreak of hostilities added very considerably to the burden of his normal responsibilities; in addition to his other duties, he was called upon to meet the needs of the Armies in the field in matters connected with the supply of equipment and stores required for the purposes of the electrical engineering services at the Front.

In recognition of his distinguished services during the Great War, he received promotion in April, 1915, as a Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel, and, in the year following, the President of the French Republic bestowed on him the Croix d'Officier de la Légion d'Honneur (London Gazette, April 15, 1916). He attained the substantive rank of Lieutenant-Colonel on December 31, 1916, and continued to hold his appointment at the War Office until the date of his death, which occurred very suddenly in London on May 31, 1917.

Age: 47 years. Unmarried.

The following Office Order was issued by the Director of Fortifications and Works, War Office:—

"It is with the deepest sorrow that the D.F.W. has to announce the death on the 31st May of Lieutenant-Colonel A. H. Dumaresq, R.E., Inspector of Electric Lights. The sudden death of this most talented officer, who up to the very end continued his duties, has removed from the Staff of the War Office one who, with rare self-effacement, had contributed very materially to the success of our Armies in the field not only in the supply of signalling equipment and in the ceaseless flow of immense quantities of other stores, but also in the advance of electrical science applied to field operations and in co-operation with aviation and artillery.

"Few outside those who were personally associated with him knew the vast amount of work he had done with regularity and great economy. His services had been recognized by a brevet and the grant of a foreign decoration, but they would doubtless have been further rewarded if he had lived."

The associated evidence for **NC 11820** (Lt Col Dumaresq) – is packaged separately, because the combined PDF made several documents very small, so hopefully this format is easier.

An unusual case, arguably it should have been rejected at triage. However the Enquirer has been vociferous, and endorsed by a Great War Forum thread following the outcome of the case. Their viewpoint is that the available evidence does not show Lt Col Dumaresq had relinquished his Commission at the time of his death (so therefore requested that we supply evidence to indicate why the individual doesn't warrant commemoration, because he should be treated as a Death in Service case). However, the Enquirer knows of the GRR categorisation 'Not A War Grave', and that we will not speculate on the reasons why that assessment was made.

The pencil annotation of 'Family Grave' on the GRR infers Lt Col Dumaresq's next of kin may have had an existing grave plot within the cemetery (perhaps extensive pre-War career led to family decision not to commemorate him as a FWW casualty). Unable to tell from the available evidence why Lt Col Dumaresq was assessed as 'Not A War Grave', but as an affirmative outcome, we would seek to uphold that historic Commission decision, in the knowledge that the information detailing the reasons for the categorisation may no longer exist. Whilst there is evidence that the individual would meet the Commission's criteria for commemoration as a Death in Service case and death occurred within the qualifying dates, there are not grounds to warrant overturning the historic decision that Lt Col Dumaresq was not to be considered a Commonwealth war casualty, for reasons undetermined.
