REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Egg Imports

Thank you for your request for information of 29th August about Egg Imports. APHA have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Your information request and our response are set out below.

"Please can you provide data on the number of eggs imported by country for the last six

years (2018,2019,2020,2021,2022,2023 so far)? I am looking for all countries in which

the UK received imported eggs in those years.

Please can you break it down by country and state where you go up to in 2023."

The information requested can be found in Appendix 1 with the addition of further data.

There are 2 tables in Appendix 1.

Table 1 as previously supplied is for eggs classed as live animals which are recorded as number of eggs.

Table 2 is for eggs classed as Products of Animal Origin (POAO - typically 'eggs for consumption'), which are recorded by weight, not number of eggs, hence were omitted from the original response.

The data provided in both tables is from 01/01/2018 to 31/08/2023.

The information that we have provided is a true reflection of the information that we have access to. We cannot guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been input into external customer facing systems by third parties.
