Please can you answer the following queries:

- What was the purpose of these samples
- What were these blood samples use for
- Outline the methodologies applied
- What was the outcomes of this concerning UK serving personal and Armed Forces veterans
- Was there a collaboration of stakeholders involved in collation of data / samples / funding
- What other countries collaborated
- Who were the stakeholders involved
- Who and how as this assisted the beneficiaries"

Your enquiry is being treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm that recorded information in scope of your request is held.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you might find it helpful to note recorded information held by MOD on the Gulf Veterans' Medical Assessment Programme (GVMAP) advises the GVMAP, based at the Baird Health Centre in London, provided a specialised referral facility for investigation of deployment-related health problems in respect of Op GRANBY (the 1990/1991 Gulf Conflict) and Op TELIC (the 2003 Gulf Conflict). The role of the GVMAP was to assess patients and to recommend treatment. It did not provide treatment. Recommendations for

treatment identified as a result of the assessment process were passed to the patient's doctor to arrange further treatment and/or referral as appropriate.
