## Introduction

Hello. I'm Ashwaaq Hassan, a civil servant from the Grenfell Tower site management team. This update gives you information on works happening at the site, and how to get in touch. Our contact details are on each slide and at the end of this update.

## The seventh anniversary of the Grenfell Tower tragedy

- Commemorations for the seventh anniversary of the Grenfell Tower tragedy will be community-led and we are keen to support where we can.
- Grenfell Tower will be illuminated in green during the following times: From 8pm on Thursday 13 June, to 6am on Friday 14 June and from 8pm to around midnight on Friday 14 June.
- We are supporting the community with access to the Grenfell Tower site over 13, 14 and 15 June. We have written to families and the immediate community separately with the details of this.
- Bereaved families and survivors of the tragedy, as well as local residents, will be able to access the site on Thursday 13 June from 12pm to 7pm.
- The site will also be accessible to bereaved families and survivors only on Friday 14 June from 7.30am to 7pm and Saturday 15 June from 9am to 1pm. There is no need to book, but if you would prefer to book a specific time slot, you can contact us using the details at the end of this update.
- Access to the site is off Bramley Road via Station Walk where members of the team will be there to welcome you.
- While you are visiting the site, we would be grateful if you could ensure that anyone under 18 is always accompanied by an adult.
- Families have also respectfully asked that you refrain from taking photographs within the site or sharing the details of access to the site on social media.
- Local residents may notice increased activity at the site during this time. The green lighting will also be tested during this period.

## Health and wellbeing

#### **Principal contractor reappointment**

Deconstruct UK Ltd (DUK), part of a wider group of companies called De-Group, has been reappointed as the principal contractor of the Grenfell Tower site.

This contract was reprocured due to government rules and guidance on spending public money. It is a standard process and is part of the government's role in keeping the tower and site secure and stable.

#### Site maintenance

Tower site contractors, DUK continue to carry out regular maintenance and checking of:

- the 'props' - which are the metal supports in the tower

-the external site hoardings and gates

-the lighting and alarm systems and the 24-hour security system.

They inspect the scaffolding around the tower each week and carry out any necessary maintenance.

Lighting around the site is controlled using motion sensors and timers. The timings of the banner lighting are adjusted every two weeks according to sunset time.

## **RBKC's Lancaster West Estate refurbishment**

RBKC's refurbishment work on the Lancaster West Estate walkways is due to continue until April 2025.

Some of the refurbishment works require council contractors to access the Grenfell tower site and garage areas. We have let the council know that their drivers should

act with consideration when attending the site and passing through the entrance gates to avoid disturbing residents.

### Air quality monitoring

The air quality in the Grenfell Tower area and at the tower site is monitored and assessed to understand if there is a risk to health.

Current evidence suggests the risk to public health from air pollution in the area remains low. We are aware of the health concerns in the community and work closely with NHS England so that anyone worried about their health can access the support they need.
