

The FT have been in touch as they are publishing article today discussing Simon Blagden's role at BDUK and potential conflicts of interest arising from his previous lobbying for CityFibre Ltd. The journalist has said that the story will also report that Mr Blagden has been a long standing Conservative donor and was non-executive chairman of Fujitsu Telecommunications Ltd in the UK for 14 years, until 2019, during which time many of the issues with Horizon and the Post Office surfaced. He has asked if BDUK are aware of Simon's former lobbying on behalf of CityFibre.



ISSUE:

- Over the last few days, DSIT press inbox has received several queries on Simon Bladgen, Chair of BDUK, and his interests and involvement in Fujitsu.
- The issued responses to these queries can be found in ANNEX A and ANNEX B.
- We have since had a follow up question from a freelance journalist, who
 asked if there is a reason that Avre Partnership and other companies Mr
 Blagden owns are now listed on the BDUK Register of Interests.
- This has since been updated to reflect Simon's positions at the Avre Partnership and Larkspur International.
- A separate query from questions:
 - Ahead of Mr Blagden's appointment to UK government roles, what due diligence was conducted in relation to his former role with Fujitsu?

- 2. Is the government aware whether Mr Blagden has any remaining financial interests in Fujitsu?
- 3. Has the government established whether there are any outstanding legal liabilities from his time at Fujitsu?
- DSIT Press Office have been asked to comment.
