FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR REPORTED IN 2023, 2022 AND 2021

We refer to your email dated 12 February 2024 to the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP), which was acknowledged on 13 February 2024.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

Please could you provide me with the following information, in Excel or similar spreadsheet form if possible:

1. What is the total number of incidents of anti-social behaviour reported to your police force in each of the following calendar years: 2023, 2022 and 2021?

2. Out of the total number reported, how many reports resulted in a police officer attending the scene in each of the following calendar years: 2023, 2022 and 2021.

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that the MDP does hold information in scope of your request.

We only have access to information back to August 2021, which is as follows:

Year	Number of anti social behaviour reports	Number attended by MDP
2021	134	93
2022	323	222
2022	208	161

The Ministry of Defence Police takes all reports of this nature seriously and will respond appropriately. It is common practice to work with local Home Office Police Forces to either attend incidents at their request or to hand over case responsibility to them.
