JUDGMENT

The judgment of the Tribunal is as follows:

Wages

- 1. The complaint of unauthorised deductions from wages (salary, commission, tips) is well-founded. The respondent made an unauthorised deduction from the claimant's wages for the period 30 August 2022 to 30 December 2023.
- 2. The respondent shall pay the claimant £2110.31 gross. The claimant is responsible for the payment of any income tax or National Insurance to His Majesty's Revenue and Customs.

Holiday Pay

3. The claimant's claim for unauthorised deduction from wages (holiday pay) is well-founded.

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4. The respondent shall pay the claimant £2288.00 gross. The claimant is responsible for the payment of any income tax or National Insurance to His Majesty's Revenue and Customs.

Notice Pay

5. The complaint of breach of contract in relation to notice pay is well founded. The respondent shall pay the claimant £312.00 gross as damages for breach of contract. The claimant is responsible for the payment of any income tax or National Insurance to His Majesty's Revenue and Customs.
