1.0 Details

Proposal

Erection of a solar photovoltaic farm with supporting infrastructure and battery storage, inverters and transformers, fencing, landscaping works and connecting cable.

The Applicant has submitted this application directly to the Planning Inspectorate.

The Site does not contain designated heritage assets and is not within a Conservation Area.

3.0 Heritage Assets

Designated heritage assets in proximity of the site fall within the boundary of East Herts District Council.

4.0 Comments on Proposal

The Heritage Assessment (HA) provides a balanced assessment of the history of the Site, the character of the area and the significance of the application Site.

The application Site is a large area of arable land. The historic farmstead Wickham Hall lies to the east of the Site boundary and contains several designated heritage assets however all lie within East Herts boundary. The proposal will impact their setting to some extent, however in my opinion the effect would be negligible due to the proposed landscaped buffer to the southeast of the Site. The supporting series of existing and proposed photomontages detailed within the



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Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment (LVIA) provides clear imagery to illustrate the anticipated screening by vegetation, for five and ten years post construction.

Conclusion

The proposed developed will not impact built heritage within the Uttlesford District boundary.
