


Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine is a direct threat to the UK's prosperity and security. That is why we are proud to be a leading ally in vital support for Ukraine.

In total, almost £12.7bn has been spent in support of Ukraine



Diplomacy

Supported <u>UNGA resolutions</u> condemning: Russia's invasion of Ukraine [Mar 22, Feb 23]; attempted illegal annexation of 4 eastern Ukrainian regions [Oct 22]; and attacks on Ukraine's critical energy infrastructure [Jul 24]

Invoked Moscow Mechanism 4 times via OSCE since Feb 22

<u>'Extraordinary Revenue Acceleration' Loans</u> for Ukraine, agreed by the G7, will make available \$50bn by end 2024

Military

7.6bn total support, including £3bn for 2024/25

Commitment to provide $£3bn \ a \ year$ until 2030/31, and for as long as it takes [10 Jul]

Sent ~400 different capabilities to Ukraine. New package incl. Brimstone missiles & ammunition [7 Jul]

A new <u>UK/Ukraine Defence Industrial Support Treaty</u> makes it easier for Ukraine to draw on £3.5bn of export finance to support its armed forces [19 Jul]

Over 45,000 Ukrainian personnel trained under Operation INTERFLEX UK-administered International Fund for Ukraine procures military equipment: £966m"><u>>£966m</u> has been pledged to date, including for a new £300m ammunition order [10 Jul]

Non-military

£5bn in non-military commitments since Feb 22. This includes £4.1bn in fiscal support through World Bank loan guarantees and £937m in bilateral assistance

£242m in bilateral assistance for 2024/25

Humanitarian

£357m humanitarian assistance to Ukraine and the region

We gave £137m in 2023/24, including winter supplies and support for the most vulnerable, in partnership with the UN, Red Cross Movement and NGOs. This contributed to an international humanitarian response that reached 11m people in Ukraine in 2023

We have provided £8.6 million to HALO Trust for demining. Over 310,000m2 land cleared (May 22 to Jun 24)

Recovery & Reconstruction

Co-hosted <u>Ukraine Recovery Conference 2023</u>, raising over \$60bn <u>War risk insurance</u> provided through MIGA to boost inward investment into Ukraine

Offered £3.5bn in UK Export Finance to cover infrastructure, health & energy projects

UK flagship initiatives include: <u>Ukraine Business Compact</u>, <u>G7+ Clean Energy Partnership</u>

Our Good Governance Fund for Ukraine, a £38m 3-year technical assistance programme, counters corruption and supports reform

Energy

Over £170m for energy security and resilience

Guaranteed a £47.5m EBRD loan to the Ukrainian state energy provider Contributed £44m to the Ukraine Energy Support Fund, including £20m in new emergency assistance [2 May]

£16m to support UK and Ukrainian innovators through UK's Innovate Ukraine Green Energy Competition

Supporting the supply of <u>vital nuclear fuel</u> to power Ukraine & maintain its independence from Russian fuel

Sanctions

The UK has sanctioned over 2,000 individuals and entities, 1,700 of which have been sanctioned since Russia's full-scale invasion, the most wide-ranging sanctions ever imposed on a major economy

UK, US and EU sanctions have deprived Russia of over \$400bn since Feb 2022 - equivalent to 4 more years funding for the invasion

We implemented a coordinated <u>UK/US ban on the trade in Russian metals</u> on the world's two largest metals exchanges [12 Apr]

According to its own Ministry of Finance, <u>Russian revenues</u> from oil and gas dropped by 24% in 2023 and Russian energy firm <u>Gazprom lost \$6.9 billion</u> - its first loss in 25 years

44 countries and the EU signed our <u>'Call to Action'</u> [18 Jul] to tackle the shadow fleet that transports Russian oil and gas outside G7 sanctions, and we have sanctioned 15 ships of the shadow fleet in total

War Crimes & Justice

£6.2m to support Ukraine's domestic war crimes investigations Additional £2m to the International Criminal Court

Active member of the 'core group' scoping options for achieving accountability for the crime of aggression

Founding member of the <u>International Register of Damage</u> to support claims by Ukrainians who have suffered losses as a result of the war

Trade

The UK-Ukraine <u>TechBridge</u> delivers projects in mutual trade, investment, innovation research and digital skills development

Our <u>City-Ukraine Hub</u> leverages UK expertise to deliver capacity building projects

Our Business Bridge Ukraine connects UK and Ukrainian businesses

Our military aid and insurance through the UK-developed <u>Unity facility</u> supported the Black Sea <u>maritime corridor</u> enabling Ukraine to <u>export</u> their full harvest this year

Ukrainians in the UK

212,100 Ukrainians have arrived in the UK, including 153,800 via Homes for Ukraine [as of 12 Aug]
