

**Income and Expenditure**

The total income of the union for the period was £402,772 (30 June 2021 - £405,446). This amount included payments of £82,722 (30 June 2021 - £85,446) in respect of membership of the union. The union's total expenditure for the period was £294,115 (30 June 2021 - £311,868). The union does not maintain a political fund.

**Salary paid to and other benefits provided to the General Secretary, President, and members of the Executive**

The General Secretary (Chief Executive Officer) of the union was paid £73,553 (30 June 2021 - £66,756) in respect of salary and £2,207 (30 June 2021 - £1,950) in respect of benefits.

No payments were made to the President of the Union (30 June 2021 - £NIL), nor to any other member of the executive (Management Committee) (30 June 2021 - £NIL).

**Irregularity statement**

A member who is concerned that some irregularity may be occurring, or have occurred, in the conduct of the financial affairs of the union may take steps with a view to investigating further, obtaining clarification and, if necessary, securing regularisation of that conduct.
