



Declaration of Transfer of an Annex A Specimen by way of Gift or Unconditional Loan

This form should be used to declare that a specimen listed in Annex A to Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 (as assimilated into UK law) was acquired by way of gift or unconditional loan and where no commercial transaction took place.

For the purposes of this declaration:

- 'gift' or 'unconditional loan' shall mean the voluntary transfer of property to another person or entity or enterprise, completely free of commercial transaction, payment or any other consideration in any form.
- 'Commercial transaction' shall mean the exchange of any specimen, part, or derivatives thereof, for monetary gain, advantage or benefit to any party where that gain, advantage or benefit takes place at any time (before, during or after the exchange)
- 'payment' is defined as: the transfer of money, equivalent, or other valuable items from one person to another in exchange for goods or services received.
