The future of Grenfell Tower

The Deputy Prime Minister is responsible for decisions on the future of Grenfell Tower. No decision has yet been made. She recognises the importance of working sensitively with the Grenfell Tower Memorial Commission and the community on this issue and supports progress towards a fitting and lasting memorial.

Grenfell Tower Inquiry report

The Grenfell Tower Inquiry's final report was published on 4 September. It includes 58 recommendations. The Prime Minister has said he will respond to the recommendations within six months.

The principal contractor of the Grenfell Tower site

Deconstruct UK Ltd (DUK), part of a wider group of companies called De-Group, was reappointed as the principal contractor of the Grenfell Tower site earlier this year. This contract was reprocured due to government rules and guidance on spending public money. It is a standard process and is part of the government's role in keeping the tower and site secure and stable. To find out more about the procurement process, please go to:

DUK carries out regular maintenance and checks of the props (the metal supports installed in the tower), the hoardings around the site, and the lighting, security systems and scaffolding.
