Further support for woodland creation

In addition to our offer, there is a lot of further support available for woodland creation. There are a number of national charities that you can turn to for information and resources, as well as local organisations. For support with understanding your land and its natural attributes you can access data sets on our Land Information Search (LIS) or MAGIC tool, or if you are within a National Park or Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, make sure to contact your local representative for assistance.

It is important to plant the right tree, in the right place, and that sometimes means that woodland creation isn't the answer. Initial checks will help you identify protected sites that are unlikely to be suitable for planting or other features, such as peat soils or priority habitats, that need to be preserved. For support with other land use interventions contact organisations such as Catchment Sensitive Farming, Natural England, or the Environment Agency amongst others.
