The development proposed; Construction of 16 dwellings including 40% affordable housing and associated infrastructure at Land East of Ugley Village Hall, falls within the description at 10(b) of Schedule 2 to the EIA Regulations. Having taken into account the criteria in Schedule 3 to the above EIA Regulations, the Proposed Development would not be likely to have significant effects on the environment for the following reasons:

The Proposed Development is not within a 'sensitive area' as defined by Regulation 2 of the above EIA Regulations. The thresholds in 10 (b) of Schedule 2 are not exceeded. The Proposed Development is in proximity to Hall's Quarry Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and Quendon Wood SSSI.
