

Application for Approval to Undertake Private TB Interferon Gamma Testing of Cattle in England

Please read the guidance on packaging of blood samples for interferon-gamma testing on the Sample Submission Form (PRIV01) before seeking approval and arranging to collect the samples. All submissions will be temperature checked upon arrival at the laboratory and any falling outside of the limits recommended by the manufacturer (within the range 22+/- 5°C) will be rejected (not tested). Farmers should be made aware that animals giving a positive result to the IFNg test are likely to be compulsory slaughtered with statutory compensation paid and the herd placed under movement restrictions. Some low risk animals giving a positive IFNg result may be retested at government discretion and expense.
