Re: S31 Grant Determination Letter for Early Years, Childcare and Families - Families First for Children Pathfinder Grant GD 31/7354.

Purpose of the Grant

The purpose of this grant is to provide support to local authorities (LA) in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them.

This grant is intended to support the projects these local authorities have been requested to undertake, relating to the Families First for Children Pathfinder (FFC) programme. Through the FFC Pathfinder programme, we will work with local areas in two waves to design and deliver end-to-end service reform, building on existing evidence to implement new Family Help services, child protection arrangements and support for family networks.

We propose to offer S31 grants to 7 local authorities to fund their work on Wave 2 of the Families First for Children (FFC) Pathfinder to expand the rollout of reform

across family help, child protection and family networks (from 3 to 10 pathfinder areas). We will work with these seven local areas, taking a test and learn approach. Applying learning from Wave 1 LAs, we will agree local models of delivery and test the deliverability of policy expectations set out in the FFC design specification, to deliver reforms across a more diverse range of areas.

Between October and November 2023, we ran an open grant competition to select areas for wave 2 of the pathfinder. We received 39 applications from LAs and their partners (police and health), which were assessed in lots based on their geography and Ofsted judgement. Following a transparent commercial process, the successful applicants from across the lots were Walsall, Luton, Warrington, Wirral, Redbridge, Lewisham and Warwickshire.

The aim of the FFCP programme in Wave 2 is to:

- Take a 'test and learn' approach to answer some of the challenging questions about 'how' to operationalise, integrate and embed reforms – and how these will work - in local areas.
- Work with the key partners in local areas on the reform journey, creating sector champions.
- Develop evidence about specific new ways of working, including where there are risks and how to mitigate these.
- Inform future revisions of the statutory framework (including *Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018*).
- Provide evaluation evidence on implementation, delivery, and any emerging impacts, including any barriers, facilitators, and unintended consequences.
- Evidence implementation costs for the reforms.

In March 2024, HMT approved initial payments of £60k to each area to fund their pre-implementation and planning work. This was paid under Grant Determination Letter GD 31/7152.

The payments specified in this grant letter will enable:

- i) Wave 2 local areas to continue to prepare in April and May for FFC implementation as they move towards delivery from July 2024. This includes producing final delivery and costed plans for the pathfinder in their area and to begin engagement with the programme's national partners (DfE, external Delivery Partner and independent Evaluation Partner); and
- ii) following the completion of delivery and costed plans, funding will support delivery of the agreed local models in 2024/25.

Local areas will receive support from an external delivery partner, Mutual Ventures with Innovation Unit, to help them implement the required changes.

DfE will work with the Evaluation Partner (Verian, Alma Economics and National Children's Bureau (NCB)), selected through the commercial process of appointing a preferred supplier to evaluate the impact of this programme.

Annex A provides details of the indicative grant payment being made, up to a maximum, to local authorities involved in the programme where funding was agreed during 2024-25 in instalments (anticipated July, September and December 2024).

Families First for Children Pathfinder programme GRANT DETERMINATION [2024-25]: 31/7354.

The Secretary of State for Education (“the Secretary of State”), in exercise of the powers conferred by section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003, makes the following determination:

Citation

1) This determination may be cited as the Families First for Children Pathfinder programme Grant Determination [2024-25].

Purpose of the grant

2) The purpose of the grant is to provide support to local authorities in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them.

Determination

3) The Secretary of State determines the authorities to which grant is to be paid and the amount of grant to be paid; these are set out in Annex A.

Treasury consent

4) Before making this determination in relation to local authorities in England, the Secretary of State obtained the consent of the Treasury.

Payment arrangements

5) The indicative grant to be paid to each authority, up to a maximum, is set out at Annex A. Final grant amounts may be lower than the maximum published figure and will be subject to ongoing pathfinder delivery and corresponding financial returns, submitted by Pathfinder areas. The grant will be paid in instalments and will be for the sum attributed to a proportion of the fixed costs to Families First for Children Pathfinder local authorities in the 2024-25 financial year.

UK Government Branding

6) The Grant Recipient shall at all times during and following the end of the Funding Period:

6.1 comply with requirements of the Branding Manual in relation to the Funded Activities; and

6.2 cease use of the Funded by UK Government logo on demand if directed to do so by the Authority.

7) **Branding Manual** means the HM Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland ‘Funded by UK Government branding manual’ first published by the Cabinet Office in November 2022 and is available at
