

# UK Support to Ukraine

Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine is a direct threat to the UK's prosperity and security. That is why we are proud to be a leading ally in vital support for Ukraine.

# Diplomacy

Supported <u>UNGA resolutions</u> condemning Russia's: invasion [Mar 22, Feb 23]; attempted annexation of 4 Ukrainian regions [Oct 22]; & attacks on Ukraine's energy infrastructure [Jul 24]. We use the UNSC to condemn Russia's actions & reaffirm support for Ukraine

At OSCE, we call out Russia weekly & co-fund Support Programme for Ukraine. <u>4 fact-finding missions</u> reported on human rights abuses

<u>'Extraordinary Revenue Acceleration' Loans</u> for Ukraine, agreed by the G7 [Jun 24], will make available \$50bn

### Military

7.8bn total support, including £3bn for 2024/25

Commitment to provide  $\underline{\text{£3bn a year}}$  until 2030/31, and for as long as it takes [10 Jul]

Sent approx. 400 different capabilities to Ukraine. <u>New packages</u> incl. Brimstone missiles & ammunition [7 Jul] & <u>650 LMM missiles</u> [6 Sep]

A new <u>UK/Ukraine Defence Industrial Support Treaty</u> expands the range of military equipment that can be funded via £3.5bn of UK Export Finance-guaranteed loans [19 Jul]

Over 47,000 Ukrainian personnel trained under Operation INTERFLEX. Scheme <u>extended</u> until at least end 2025 [6 Sep]

UK-administered International Fund for Ukraine procures military equipment:  $\geq \underline{f1bn}$  has been pledged to date [11 Sep], including for a new  $\underline{f300m}$  ammunition order [10 Jul]

# Non-military

£5bn in non-military commitments since Feb 22. This includes:

- $\underline{$ £4.1bn in fiscal support through World Bank loan guarantees.  $\underline{$ \$484m to be deployed before end 2024 [11 Sep]
- £937m in bilateral assistance.  $\underline{£242m}$  in 2024/25 fund reform, humanitarian, energy, recovery & reconstruction programmes

# Humanitarian

 $\underline{\text{E457m}}$  total assistance to Ukraine and the region.

At least £100m in humanitarian assistance in 2024/25 [11 Sep]

This will support protection & life-saving assistance focused on the most vulnerable, a well-coordinated & well-funded response via the int'l system, and we will press for respect for int'l humanitarian law & access, to reach those who need it & so evacuations happen safely

We have provided  $\pm 8.6$  million to HALO Trust for demining. Over  $310,000m^2$  land cleared (May 22 to Jun 24)

# **Recovery & Reconstruction**

Co-hosted Ukraine Recovery Conference 2023, raising over \$60bn


War risk insurance provided through MIGA boosts inward investment

To date UK Export Finance has issued over  $\underline{\text{f500m}}$  in support of critical reconstruction, energy and defence projects

Through our Development Finance Institution, British International Investment, working with the EBRD to make trade finance available to support critical imports/exports. BII to provide up to  $\underline{£30m}$  [11 Sep]

Our Good Governance Fund for Ukraine, a £38m 3-year technical assistance programme, counters corruption and supports reform

In total, £12.8bn has been spent in support of Ukraine



### Energy

Over £370m for energy security and resilience through grant, in-kind support and loan guarantees

 $\underline{\texttt{£20m}}$  to support essential repairs and protection this year takes total support to the Ukraine Energy Support Fund to  $\underline{\texttt{£64m}}$  [11 Sep]

<u>£181m</u> from UKEF for Urenco to supply enriched uranium [18 Jul]

<u>£16m</u> to support UK and Ukrainian innovators through UK's Innovate Ukraine Green Energy Competition

Supporting the supply of <u>vital nuclear fuel</u> to power Ukraine & maintain its independence from Russian fuel

# Sanctions

>2,000 individuals and entities sanctioned, incl. 1,800 since full-scale invasion, the most wide-ranging sanctions ever on a major economy

UK, US and EU sanctions have deprived Russia of over \$400bn since Feb 2022 - equivalent to 4 more years funding for the invasion

Impact of Oil Price Cap: Russia's Ministry of Finance reported a 30% drop in tax revenues from oil in 2023. Its flagship Urals grade crude continues to trade at prices below global benchmarks in 2024

Since July, we have imposed sanctions against:

- vessels in Putin's Shadow Fleet [17 Oct, 11 Sep, 18 Jul]
- Russian troops using chemical weapons in Ukraine [8 Oct]
- 16 members of Russian cyber-crime gang Evil Corp [1 Oct]
- 5 ships & 2 entities involved in the Russian LNG sector [26 Sep]
- those involved in Iran's military support to Russia [10 Sep]

#### War Crimes & Justice

£6.2m to support Ukraine's domestic war crimes investigations Additional  $\underline{£2.3m}$  to the International Criminal Court

Active member of the <u>'core group'</u> scoping options for achieving accountability for the crime of aggression

Founding member of the <u>International Register of Damage</u> to support claims by Ukrainians who have suffered losses as a result of the war

#### Trade

The UK-Ukraine <u>Digital Trade Agreement</u> entered into force [1 Sep] The UK-Ukraine <u>TechBridge</u> delivers projects in mutual trade,

investment, innovation research and digital skills development Our City-Ukraine Hub leverages UK expertise to deliver capacity

building projects

Our UK-Ukraine <u>Business Bridge Ukraine</u> connects UK and Ukrainian businesses

Our military aid and insurance through the UK-developed <u>Unity facility</u> supported the Black Sea <u>maritime corridor</u> enabling Ukraine to <u>export</u> their full harvest this year
