Thank you for your email of 20 March 2024 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD), requesting the following information:

"The number of Armed Forces Compensation Scheme operational staff in post. By operational staff I mean those dealing with AFCS claims on a daily basis, i.e. Administrative staff, caseworkers/decision makers, and the team managers responsible for checking the caseworkers work as at 29 February 2024.

I would like the number for both the operational area for claims, appeals and payments and maintenance. Broken down into those same areas please.

I would also like the same information for the War Pension Scheme.

For both AFCS and WPS, I would like to know how many whole-time equivalents were envisaged as required to complete the operational work as described above (how many were in the business plan) for the 2023/2024 financial year.


For both AFCS and WPS, how many vacancies were there as at 29 February 2024?

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm all information in scope of your request is held. However, in order to protect personal information governed by Data Protection legislation, Section 40(2) of the FOI Act has been applied to the information by supplementing numbers less than 5 with a X. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.


