

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITTING (ENGLAND AND WALES) REGULATIONS 2016

Environmental Permitting (England) (Exercise of Functions) (Peterborough City Council) Direction 2024

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the power conferred by regulation 33(1)(b) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016¹, gives the following Direction.

1. Citation and commencement

This Direction may be cited as the Environmental Permitting (England) (Exercise of Functions) (Peterborough City Council) Direction 2024, and comes into force on the 30th of October 2024.

2. Interpretation

In this Direction-

“operator” means Crown Packaging Manufacturing UK Ltd;

“premises” means the premises listed in Schedule 1;

“relevant activities” means the activities listed in Schedule 2 carried out at the premises;

“the 2016 Regulations” means the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016.

3. Exercise of functions

From the date this Direction comes into force, and until such time as it is withdrawn or amended, the relevant functions exercisable under the 2016 Regulations by the Environment Agency in respect of the relevant activities of the operator at the premises are exercisable by Peterborough City Council.

The coating, printing and textile treatment activities falling within the description in paragraph (a) of Part A(2) of Section 6.4 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the 2016 Regulations.	Unless falling within Part A(1) of Section 6.4 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the 2016 Regulations, surface treating substances, objects or products using organic solvents, in particular for dressing, printing, coating, degreasing, waterproofing, sizing, painting, cleaning or impregnating, in plant with a consumption capacity of more than 150kg or more per hour than 200 tonnes per year.	Coating and printing of metal packaging.
Treatment of waste water from the can washing process before discharge to sewer falling within the description in paragraph (a)(ii) of Part A(1) of Section 5.4 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the 2016 Regulations	Disposal of non-hazardous waste with a capacity exceeding 50 tonnes per day (or 100 tonnes per day if the only waste treatment activity is anaerobic digestion) involving one or more of the following activities, and excluding activities covered by Council Directive 91/271/EEC concerning urban wastewater treatment— (ii)physico-chemical treatment;	Disposal of Non-hazardous waste through treatment of wastewater.
