# 09-24 UC Disregard for Capital Payments from an Estate of Infected Blood Compensation Payments

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### Introduction

 This memo gives guidance on the Social Security (Infected Blood Capital Disregard) (Amendment) Regulations 20241 [SS (IB Dis) (Amdt) Regs 2024], SI 2024/964. These changes take effect from 10.10.2024.

1 <u>SS (IB Dis) (Amdt) Regs 2024</u>

### Background

1. These regulations1 create a new disregard to allow certain payments from an estate of a deceased infected person to be disregarded.

# 1 <u>SS (IB Dis) (Amdt) Regs 2024</u>

2. The disregard applies to payments derived from a payment made from an approved blood scheme, or the Scottish Infected Blood Support Scheme to the estate of the person for having been infected.

### **Capital disregard**

- 3. These regulations1 provide that for UC, any payment out of the estate of a person, which derives from a payment made under or by
- 1. an approve blood scheme or
- 2. the Scottish Infected Blood Support Scheme

to the estate of the person as a result of that person having been infected from contaminated blood products is disregarded indefinitely.

## 1 <u>SS (IB Dis)(Amdt) Regs 2024</u>, reg 2

**Note:** The disregard in respect of the Universal Credit Regulations 2013 is linked to the State Pension Credit Regulations 2002, and as a result these regulations do not make amendments to the Universal Credit Regulations 2013.

### Example

Stephen is claiming UC. Stephen receives a payment of £20,000 from the estate of his late uncle. This money was originally paid directly to the estate of Stephen's uncle from an approved blood scheme as a result of being infected from contaminated blood products. As the payment from the estate of Stephen's uncle was derived from a payment made under an approved blood scheme, the DM decides that this payment can be disregarded indefinitely.
