Notifications of infectious diseases, some of which are later microbiologically confirmed, prompt local investigation and action to control the diseases. Proper officers are required every week to inform the UK Health Security Agency(UKHSA) (formerly the Registrar General) anonymised details of each case of each disease that has been notified. UKHSA has responsibility of collating the weekly returns from proper officers and publishing analyses of local and national trends.

#### Appendix A

UKHSA has rolled out a new case and incident management system to support the function and capabilities of our health protection teams. UKHSA paused publication of Notifiable Diseases: weekly reports after week 26 while data checks were carried out. These have now been completed and the NOIDs weekly report has been reinstated.

Due to changes in the way in which the data are now processed and mapped, including local authority codes which have been updated to the latest geographies, it would be inaccurate to compare data since week 27 to historic reports.

Further refinements to the way in which data are displayed and processed will be carried out over time and its overall quality improved. Public health action is taken on notifications as we receive them and is not impacted by the change in system.

Causative agent reporting has been unaffected by this.

Transition to the new case and incident management system has been effective from a different date in each region of England, spanning weeks 27 to 39 of 2024. The specific transition dates are included below and impact on the comparability of the statistics either side of these points:

- South East 2 July 2024 week 27
- South West 9 July 2024 week 28
- East of England 11 July 2024 week 28
- Yorkshire & Humber 16 July 2024 week 29
- North East 18 July 2024 week 29
- West Midlands 23 July 2024 week 30
- London 30 July 2024 week 31
- East Midlands 17 September 2024 week 38
- North West 24 September 2024 week 39

In some weeks it has been necessary to discard records relating to particular days because data has not been supplied in the required format. This impacts the totals in weeks 27, 32, 35, 36 and 37.

#### Appendix B - Scarlet fever and group A streptococcus reporting

Cases of scarlet fever are taking longer to appear in our published data after initial processing and review. Our teams are working at pace to ensure published data reflects all formal notifications received and local authority data will be updated once full data entry has occurred. In the meantime, our real-time <u>GP Syndromic Surveillance data</u> reflects current trends.

UKHSA teams continue to manage outbreaks of scarlet fever, irrespective of whether it has been entered into NOIDs, and have carried out all necessary public health interventions needed to reduce further transmission in outbreaks, especially in vulnerable settings such as schools and nurseries.

For scarlet fever notifications that are published, it is inaccurate to compare data since week 27 to historic reports due to a change in the way that notifications are processed.
