EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note 1s not part of the Approval)

Section 20 of the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988 (as amended) provides for the admissibility m evidence of records from pre cribed devices. Such devices must be of a descript 10n prescribed by the Secretary of State and of a type approved by him for the purpose of that section. By the Road Traffic Offenders (Prescribed Devices) Order 1993 (S.I. 1993/1698), the Secretary of State prescribed devices designed or adapted for recording a measurement of the speed of motor vehicles activated by means of a light beam or beams. This Approval approves as from 1st April 1996 for the purpose of the detect 10n of speeding offences the type of device known as the LTI 20.20. TS/M "Speedscope"
