We're proud that the money raised from fishing licence sales goes right back into angling. Between 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024 we sold 910,973 fishing licences in England, bringing in over £22,500,000. This income was reinvested to enhance fisheries, support the environment and promote the sport of angling.

In 2023-24 we teamed up with over 500 partners. By combining our resources with other organisations, we were able to make an even greater impact.

Some of the groups we collaborated with included The Angling Trust, Wild Trout Trust, Institute of Fisheries Management, the Riverfly Partnership, local river trusts, angling clubs, charities, and many more.

These partnerships allowed us to provide anglers with:

- Improved and healthier fish stocks and habitats
- New facilities and greater accessibility at fisheries
- Participation events and campaigns that introduced more people to angling
- Coordinated enforcement efforts and intelligence sharing

The Angling Trust also provides a vital role in enforcement and conservation.

- 986 otter/fish-eating bird issues and 550+ invasive species cases addressed
- ✓ 51 Angling Improvement Fund projects to manage predation and invasive non-native species totalling £220,000

Wild Trout Trust (WTT)

With £115,000 funding from us, they:

- Delivered 116 advisory visits and workshops
- Completed 11 river improvement projects
- Advice and projects enhanced 285km of river across England





Riverfly Partnership

With £59,000 funding, Riverfly Partnership trained volunteers undertook:

- **♦** 4,698 surveys
- Site monitoring at 1,075 sites across 457 rivers and 148 catchments
- Passed on 68 trigger alerts, indicating pollution impact



Ferry Meadows Fishery, Gunwade Lake: predation management

Fish populations are thriving after habitat changes and predation measures made it easier for them to hide from resident otters.

- Creation of enhanced habitat types, including floating rafts, submerged habitat reefs, marginal berms, and dedicated fish refuge zones.
- Marginal tree planting as well as tree hinging and pinning work has provided habitats that allow fish to seek refuge from predators.



Goose Green Fishery: habitat recovery

Fish stocks have recovered and anglers now enjoy bigger catches after an equipment upgrade solved a recurring issue in three of the site's lakes.


- Six aerators improved dissolved oxygen across the site.
- Algae blooms were controlled by the addition of barley straw, and planting regimes assisted in nutrient uptake.


Plough Pond: accessibility improvements

Significant accessibility improvements have made it even easier for all anglers to safely enjoy a tranquil oneacre angling club spot pond.

- Installation of a new footbridge with a handrail and flat deck, suitable for mobility scooters and wheelchairs.
- Refurbishment of existing platforms, including safer, non-slip surfaces.

We were able to stock our rivers and stillwaters with over 470,000 fish thanks to your fishing licence





Thanks to anglers like you, we released 478,937 fish into our rivers and stillwaters."

We use fishing licence income to rear fish for release, enhancing your angling experience and ensuring we're prepared to replenish stocks after environmental incidents. This also helps kickstart recovery from longer-term issues like pollution.


