The future of Grenfell Tower

The Deputy Prime Minister is responsible for decisions on the future of Grenfell Tower. No decision has yet been made. She recognises the importance of working sensitively with the Grenfell Tower Memorial Commission and the community on this issue and supports progress towards a fitting and lasting memorial.

Tower illumination and Christmas closing

Grenfell Tower will be illuminated in green on Saturday 14 December from dusk to midnight, as in previous years, to mark the half-year anniversary of the tragedy.

The Grenfell Tower site will be closed from Monday 23 December to Wednesday 1 January, but you can continue to contact us using the email address at the end of this update. Tower site contractor, DUK, will continue to carry out regular maintenance and checks over this period.

Site contractor

DUK carries out regular maintenance and checks of the props (the metal supports installed in the tower), the hoardings around the site, and the lighting, security systems and scaffolding.

Local opportunities including employment, training and practical support, are available from DUK. Some of these include:

- Careers' adviser at North Kensington Job Centre Plus
- Construction apprenticeships
- Electric van for local charities' use
- Litter picking and cleaning in public spaces near the tower site
- Advice and support for local community groups
