Non-Material Change Application to the Dogger Bank Creyke Back Offshore Wind Farm Development Consent Order 2015 (as amended)

On 28 November 2024 the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) received notice that Dogger Bank Creyke Back Offshore Wind Farm have submitted a non-material change application to The Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) to make changes to the Dogger Bank Creyke Back Offshore Wind Farm Development Consent Order. This document comprises the MMO's comments in respect of this non-material change application.

The non-material change being sought is as follows:

- An increase in the maximum hammer energy used for pin-pile installation for the offshore platform foundation structure from 1,900kJ to 3,000kJ

The MMO has now completed its consideration of this request, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 72(3)(d) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, has varied the dMLs as detailed in the Notice of Variation enclosed (Schedules 8).
