Converter academy orders

Project: An application from Seven Hills School, Sheffield, to convert and join Nexus Multi Academy Trust.

Representations received:

• No representations were made for any items discussed at this meeting.

AB discussion:

- Seven Hills School is a 120 capacity school located in Sheffield with 224 pupils on roll. The school was last inspected in May 2024 and is currently rated as Good. The published capacity is based upon the main school site only – the LA has worked with the school to set-up 2 satellite sites to accommodate the extra provision. One of the satellite sites is permanent, whilst the other is due to close in 2026 and solutions will be sought closer to the time.
- Officials' assessment of the trust using the Commissioning High Quality Trusts
 Framework was considered alongside Seven Hills School's strategic needs. In
 making the recommendation, consideration was given to the school's long-term
 strategy and the school wanting to work with a strong trust that offers opportunities
 for additional collaboration at scale.
- The board members considered the details of the project and did not raise any concerns in relation to the proposal. The Multi Academy Trust are considered to have relevant recent experience in managing similar projects.

Converter academy orders

Project: An application from Todmorden High School, Calderdale, to convert and join Share Multi Academy Trust.

Representations received:

• No representations were made for any items discussed at this meeting.

AB discussion:

 Todmorden High School is a 900 capacity school located in Calderdale with 875 pupils on roll. The school was last inspected in January 2020 and is currently rated as Good.

- Officials' assessment of the trust using the Commissioning High Quality Trusts
 Framework was considered alongside Todmorden High School's strategic needs. In
 making the recommendation, consideration was given to Todmorden High School's
 vision, and the network of support that will be available from within the Multi
 Academy Trust. There is already a strong working relationship between the school
 and the trust, and their values are well aligned.
- Todmorden High School was previously approved to join a different Multi Academy Trust in September 2023. School Governors have subsequently decided that Share Multi Academy Trust more closely aligns to their vision, and is a better fit for the school.
- This project brings additional strength to the MAT and the support of a central trust team that the school is keen to access.
- The board members considered the details of the project and did not raise any concerns in relation to the proposal.

In making the recommendation, consideration was given to the school having an existing relationship with the trust.
- This case was considered along with St Thomas CE (VC) Primary School, St John's Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School and Roberttown Church of England Voluntary Controlled Junior and Infant School.
- As a condition of approval, Schools Financial Support and Oversight to be reassured about consolidated financial forecasts for Cumberworth and St John's.
